

Sensational Toddler/Preschooler OT Tip of the Month Play

Do you know toddlers/preschoolers that...

- 1. Tend to play with the same toys and materials?
- 2. Tend to play alone rather than with peers?
- 3. Get easily frustrated during play leading to outbursts or aggression?

These children may have difficulty with this complex occupation of childhood we call "play".

Sensational Ideas for play...

- 1. Help a child succeed at play cooperatively with an adult then add one peer into the play experience.
- 2. Play next to a child with a similar toy or materials to model new ways to engage in play. Celebrate coming up with new ideas for play even if it seems to be a small change.
- 3. Practice a game that other children like to play first so the child is familiar with the motor skills and rules of game, then coach during the group play.
- 4. Encourage imaginative, open ended play using his/her familiar themes or characters in the play. Provide some props to help expand this theme with the child.
